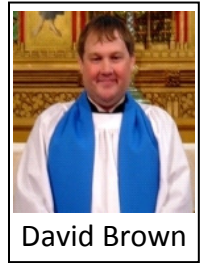
Renewal...

Feeding the Food Bank

Life can be hard, and for some families, it can be a decision between paying a fuel bill or buying food. More and more families are in crisis, turning to food banks to help them meet their most basic needs. **We are now in a position to help those families and the food bank!**

Families in crisis need to be referred to the food bank, where they will receive food for three days, appropriate to the size of size of their family.

St. Matthew's has  become an official referring agency (with David and Julie J being authorised agents). We can now directly help the most needy people in our parish.

We all have a part to play!

The food banks are in daily need of food to replenish their stocks. A collection box is going to be placed in church every Saturday and Sunday, for anyone to put in their donations, starting the first weekend in May. A shopping list will be available, as there are specific items which the food bank needs. When the box is full, the donations will be taken to

the food bank. This collection will be advertised to the local community, so that they too can be a part of this great work, by bringing food during our *Saturday Café*. **Please support this vital work! Breakfast Club is for young adults (YA) in school Years 7 and above. We don't specify a "too old" limit so far, and I can't see that changing. We meet during the first service on the last Sunday of every month, with the exception of Easter month; and December, when it is between Christmas and New Year. We eat cereal and toast, and have tea, coffee and fruit juice available.



Nothing is expected of those who attend except that they will eat (and even that has been known to not happen... Rebecca once forgot and had breakfast before she arrived). We prefer it if they join in the discussion that follows food, although toast is usually still going during the discussion.

The original idea was to allow the YA to decide which way the group would evolve and, although not much has changed so far, we've had some of them step forward to lead the discussion, which involved picking the topic from a book and asking the questions.

As a YA group we mostly have adult helpers picked from the Leadership team, rather than adults associated with the younger children. We try to treat them in a more grown-up style.
