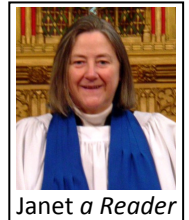

## May I?

As a child growing up on Fox Street, we used to play a game called 'May I?' One of us stood on the pavement on one side of the street, the rest on the pavement opposite (in those days there were very few motor vehicles and streets were used as playgrounds). The 'one' called out a name and how many steps to take. That person was only allowed to move if they asked 'May I?'

This game frequently comes to mind when we pray 'I/we may', such as, 'that we may perfectly love you...' in the prayer of preparation, and 'grant that we may serve you in newness of life...' in the prayer of penitence, both from the communion service. I remind myself that its use in this context is not a request, not to be understood as an option. We are being much more positive than that! We will do something but we need to remember that we will not be alone, God will be with us.

The letters of the word can be thought of as an acronym. MAY - Me And You. An acknowledgement that God is with us, working with us, always a support and help in all we do.



If we were to replace *may* with *will*, could we be sure that it would not lead us down a selfish, self-centred path, forgetting the vital role our Lord God has in all we do? Surely that is too great a risk to take. That being said, we should be positive in our faith that with God's help we will achieve what he needs us to do.

So might I suggest that in our prayers, where we are praying 'we may', it means 'with Your help Lord, we will!' And God will bless you in all works you do in his name.

God has never given up on me, has often assured me he has plans for my life. He has

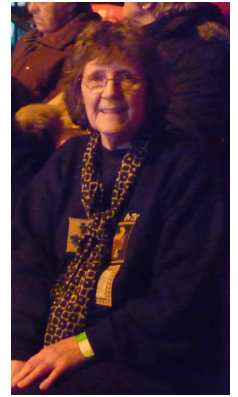
### Honouring God
