### Love Shine a Light

You are the light of the world - like a city on a hilltop that cannot be hidden. Matthew 5:14

As I prepared to write this article I received a wonderfully uplifting email message from a member of our congregation - real original words; not an internet round-robin! Having thanked the sender, I shared with someone else that the words, and the simple and gracious love behind them, made me beam - not simply smile - but beam.

Thoughts of that word *beam* then flung me straight back to my now (VERY) long ago Sunday School days and those formative, and never to be forgotten, Christian memories of knowing that Jesus wanted me for a sunbeam; alongside the call upon my life that came in the words of Jesus bids us shine with a pure clear light.

Nowadays, I don't feel I could totally concur with the tagline of that particular hymn - you in your small corner and I in mine - as I think the call is to shine out together in unity for God; though I take the point that each of us must keep on being a sunbeam, must keep on shining out, in this world of darkness, even, and perhaps especially, when we are away from the observant gaze of the rest of our fellowship. As we continue our Lenten reflections through these weeks of preparation for the bursting forth of that glorious beam of light that comes with the



risen Jesus, we perhaps should consider whether the way we live, the things we say, our reactions to other people, are fulfilling that call to shine out constantly and consistently for Jesus - for as the words of that hymn tell us, *Well he sees and knows it if our light is dim.* 

Called to reflect the light of Jesus who is the Eternal Light - to the world, let's ask ourselves: what effect is my life having on other people? Do I make them beam on a regular basis or is the response to my behaviour more likely to be a grimace through gritted teeth?

Jesus bids us shine first of all for him.

The Day of Prayer begins as dawn breaks over the islands of Tonga in the Pacific and continues across each continent until the last Services of this special day are held back in the Pacific on the islands of Samoa, circling the world in prayer for about 36 hours.

#### *House of Bishops' Pastoral Letter on the 2015 General Election*

The House of Bishops of the Church of England expressed the hope for political parties to discern "a fresh moral vision of the kind of country we want to be" ahead of the General Election in May.

In a pastoral letter to the people and parishes of the Church of England, the Bishops urge Christians to consider the question how can we "build the kind of society which many people say they want but which is not yet being expressed in the vision of any of the parties?"
